



COVID-19 Policies and Protocol - June 1, 2020

Due to Coronavirus (COVID-19), we are taking extra precautions with the care of every client, employee, and associate to include new policies, a health history review, and enhanced sanitation & disinfecting procedures in compliance with Washington State and CDC guidelines.

In these unprecedented times, we want to assure clients that we are taking this situation seriously, and we have outlined protocol that relates specifically to photography.

Each project is different and might require additional thought on to how to proceed, but these guidelines should help you understand how our work will be impacted. Indoor photography, for instance, will require much more consideration than outdoor photography. We will certainly be able to provide the same level of photography to our clients as we have in the past, and we look forward to working with you.

Team Sports Images wants to assure you of its continued commitment to maintaining a safe and healthy workplace and that we are taking additional measures to help protect you from the spread of COVID-19.

As part of those efforts, we are implementing the following policies. Please read this document carefully and the guidelines that follow specific to photography.

COVID-19 is highly contagious.

- COVID-19 spreads among people who are in close contact (within about 6 feet, or two arm lengths) for a prolonged period (between 10 and 30 minutes, depending on the distance).
- The virus generally spreads when an infected person coughs, sneezes, or talks; droplets from their mouth or nose get in the air and land in the mouths or noses of nearby people.
- A person who has the virus may not have any symptoms but may still spread COVID-19.
- A person can get COVID-19 by touching another person, such as with a handshake, touching another surface or object that has the virus on it and then touching their mouth, nose, or eyes.
- The virus can live on surfaces for up to several days, depending on the surface and other conditions.

Importance of Social Distancing

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has found that one of the most effective ways of preventing the spread of COVID-19 is limiting face-to-face contact with others, known as social distancing or physical distancing. The Occupational Safety and Health Authority (OSHA) similarly recommends increased social distancing when preparing workplaces to respond to COVID-19.

This Social Distancing Policy is a vital part of our overall strategy and commitment to maintaining a healthy workplace considering the COVID-19 pandemic. Although knowledge about the virus and how it spreads is evolving, based on the information currently available, these measures will help to limit its spread. Compliance with this policy is essential because the current consensus on the virus suggests, among other things, that:

Social Distancing Measures

Following Washington State and current CDC guidance, Team Sports Images requires that you comply with the following protocols and procedures while on-set or on-location:

- All participants should travel separately to and from the shoot location to limit exposure.
- The photographer only will handle cameras and camera equipment.
- Assistant(s) only will handle all lighting and grip equipment.
- When it comes time to cleanup and de-clutter, one person should work in a specific area rather than multiple people working in the same area.
- Proof Sheets will be available online only.
- Often, we work with one or more assistants, but to limit the number of people at the shoot, we will consider working without an assistant if we think it is possible to achieve our existing quality photographs in a timely manner.



- Large Gatherings are Prohibited. Large in-person gatherings and in-person meetings of more than five (5) people are prohibited during our photo shoots.
- Maintain a six-foot distance from others when crossing paths, walking near others, or waiting to use equipment.
- No Physical Greetings. Do not shake hands or greet others in any manner that requires physical contact (PLEASE, NO FIST OR ELBOW BUMBS either!). In these extraordinary times, we consider this as polite and the right thing to do. Not rude.
- Visitor Limitations. Unexpected visitors to the shoot location may result in delays to the shoot or complete shut-down of the shoot.
- Shared Supplies and Equipment. Do not share supplies and equipment. Limit the use of shared photo, video, and other equipment, such as cameras and lights, to the extent consistent with necessity. If you absolutely need to use this equipment:
 - Use hand sanitizer before and after each equipment use.
 - Use disposable gloves when using shared equipment; and,
 - Disinfect equipment with wipes before and after each use on all touch surfaces.
 - Remain flexible. Adhere to new guidelines as they emerge, as this issue is new and continuously evolving.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Clients, assistants, and tenants of the spaces where we are photographing should provide their own PPE; however, Team Sports Images will have masks and hand sanitizer on hand if needed.

Other Photography Considerations

- Expect to get fewer views in each timeframe so since everything may take longer under these current conditions.
- Clients who choose not to attend the shoot can receive updates. Fewer people assisting during photography will further reduce the number of shots in a day.
- Scouting in advance will be even more useful now. We can develop the image list and also review protocol(s) for client, crew, and tenant safety.
- Thought should be given to having people (models) in the photos. Who will they be, and is it safe to have more people at the shoot? Ask yourself, “Can we maintain all safety protocols while not having masks on models?”
- Clients should verify that bathrooms will be made available to all attendees.
- Thought should be given to where meals are coming from and where a lunch break will be taken.
- We may adapt to specific rules and guidelines at each location if they are different than ours.

Policy Modification

Government and public health guidelines, restrictions, business, and industry best practices regarding COVID-19 change as new information becomes available, and as further research is conducted. Team Sports Images reserves the right to modify this policy at any time at its sole discretion in order to adapt to changing circumstances and business needs, consistent with its commitment to maintaining a safe and healthy workplace.

Enforcement and Non-Retaliation

Failure to comply with these social distancing measures may result in discipline, up to and including termination of employment (for assistants and others hired by Team Sports Images). If you witness or become aware of any individuals violating this policy, you are required to report them to Team Sports Images immediately.

Team Sports Images prohibits any form of discipline, reprisal, intimidation, or retaliation for reporting a violation of this policy or any other health and safety concern. Employees also have the right to report work-related injuries and illnesses. Team Sports Images will not discharge, discriminate, or otherwise retaliate against employees for reporting work-related injuries or illnesses.



Policy Administration

Team Sports Images is responsible for administering and enforcing this policy. If you have any questions about this policy or have questions about health and safety that are not addressed in this policy, please contact Team Sports Images or Robert Veal.

We are following these enhanced procedures to prevent the spread of COVID-19:

- No physical greetings allowed. (PLEASE, NO FIST OR ELBOW BUMBS either!)
- Visitors are prohibited unless scheduled, and who have agreed to the statement below*
- Individuals should provide their PPE; however, Team Sports Images will have masks and hand sanitizer on hand if needed.
- Maintain a minimum six-foot distance from others.
- Masks Are REQUIRED UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE!
- Photograph individuals with the longest lens possible to maintain acceptable distance.
- Wash hands with soap & water for 20+ seconds or use hand sanitizer (≥60% alcohol) after restroom, after coughing/sneezing, and before/after eating and/or each equipment use using
- Disinfect touch surfaces and equipment before and after each use.
- Keep personal objects out of reach.
- Avoid sharing equipment; otherwise use disposable gloves
- Gatherings of five (5) or more are prohibited.
- Stay home when sick, at least 3 days after recovery and at least 7 days since first symptoms
- Individuals are required bring their own food or drinks.

Symptoms of COVID-19 include:

- Fever
- Fatigue
- Dry Cough
- Difficulty Breathing
